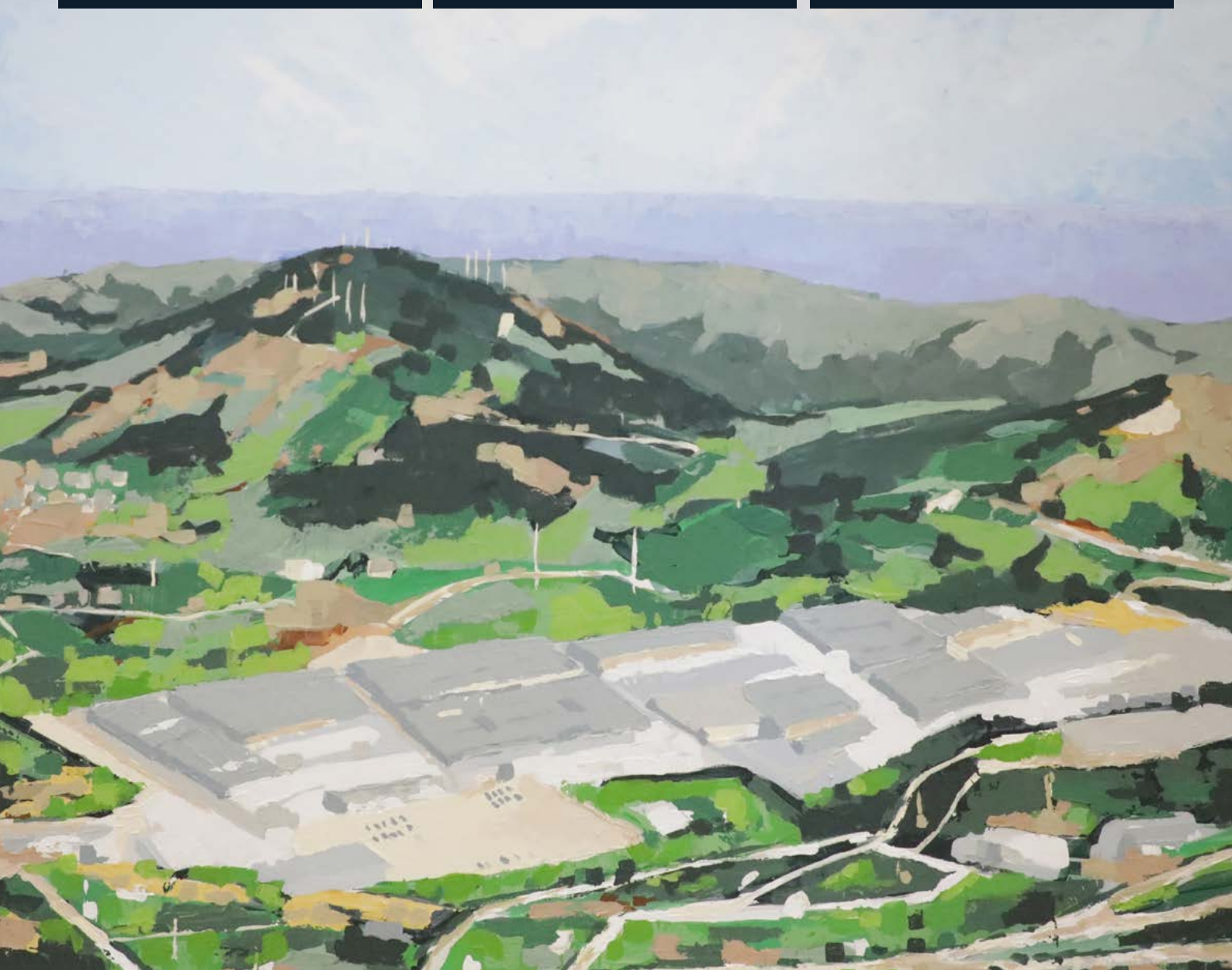

MEETING OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE OF THE PORT AUTHORITIES OF TANGER MED AND THE BAY OF ALGECIRAS



A delegation from the Port of Algeciras led by its Chairman, Mr. Gerardo Landaluce, met with the Chairman of Tanger Med Group, Mr. Fouad Brini, and the management team for the coordination of joint actions including the Marhaba 2022 operation and the platform for facilitating the flow of goods across the Strait of Gibraltar.

The working groups analyzed among other themes, the progress made under the Memorandum of Understanding signed between the ports of the Strait of Gibraltar in 2019 to optimize the maritime link both from the point of view of passengers and the growing traffic of goods between the two shores.

PRESENTATION BY THE CHAIRMAN OF TANGER MED GROUP AT THE 47TH SESSION OF THE ACADEMY OF THE KINGDOM OF MOROCCO ON THE THEME OF “THE MEDITERRANEAN AS A REFERENCE POINT”



Mr. Fouad Brini, Chairman of Tanger Med Group, was invited to participate in the 47th session of the Academy of the Kingdom of Morocco held between May 24th and 27th under the theme "The Mediterranean as a Reference Point". A theme that brought together several academics, thinkers, and researchers from fifteen countries, in order to address the issues raised by the economic, ecological, geopolitical, and cultural transformations that drive the Mediterranean area.

He opened the 4th session of the event on May 26th in a panel made up of economists, anthropologists, and academics dealing with the economic and social dimension in the Mediterranean and the development projects within it. Mr. Fouad Brini spoke about the position of the Mediterranean within the global maritime routes. Considering this area as a true civilizational crossroads, recalling that the Mediterranean was a unique line of contact between Europe and Africa, but also between the East and the West. He pointed out that pursuant to its development, a thousand years ago, the first maritime routes were developed, the result of a commercial reality, which still today, sets the pace for our economies and lifestyles.

He then referred to the role of globalization which has increased the weight of maritime trade in global trade, now amounting to 90% of the total volume of world trade. He mentioned three key levers that have contributed, since the 1960s, to the intensification of world trade, particularly by sea. First of all, oil has changed transportation systems. Second, the container, an ordinary metal box, has revolutionized global trade and boosted the share of maritime transport in world trade, thanks to its indisputable advantages in terms of productivity, volume consolidation, and intermodality. He also discussed the emergence of the manufacturing power of Asian countries which has accelerated the phenomenon of globalization and supported the dominance of maritime trade.



He mentioned the role of the Mediterranean and the Suez Canal Straits, strategic locations that punctuate the maritime routes and allow shipowners to save considerable time. He recalled that the Mediterranean concentrates three of the world's eight strategic passages and 20% of world maritime trade.

In addition to these major points, Mr. Fouad Brini said that the Mediterranean has emerged as a place of transit for global shipping routes that have fostered the development of industrial port hubs that ensure the connection with the land, and which are supported by shipping companies to transship their goods and carry out their import-export operations. The Tanger Med project, born of the vision of his Majesty King Mohammed VI, has become, in the space of a few years, a leading industrial and logistical hub in the Mediterranean, helping to place Morocco among the world's greatest maritime nations.

The Chairman also mentioned the crises that have been experienced since 2019, the uncertainties that have arisen, and the questions that have been raised about the future positioning of the Mediterranean within maritime exchanges. He reiterated the challenges that need to be addressed in order to ensure resilient supply chains and their sustainability. He also mentioned the geopolitical but also industrial and logistical stakes, new elements of sovereignty of the economies. A new paradigm is emerging: the relocation of production near consumption centers, which could position the Mediterranean as a competitive advantage for Europe from Africa.

He also pointed out the environmental issue by noting that maritime trade accounts for a significant share of global greenhouse gas emissions. He spoke of the race to decarbonize the industry and shipping, with carbon neutrality targets for 2050. He also raised the opportunities that such a transition could generate and in particular the emergence of new hubs of clean energy supply in the Mediterranean, capable of reconfiguring North-South relations.

Finally, he mentioned the central role of digitization and Data in maintaining supply chains. This role is confirmed by e-commerce leaders such as Amazon or Alibaba, whose mastery of data has enabled them to build a real lead in terms of logistics and door-to-door offers. He concluded by saying that the control of trade was once in the hands of the maritime leadership, but that today, and certainly in the future, this control will be in the hands of those who handle and utilize the Data.

OPERATION MARHABA: MOROCCANS RESIDING ABROAD RECEPTION ARRANGEMENTS FOR 2022



Following the last two years marked by the health crisis, Tanger Med Passengers Port has started the Marhaba 2022 campaign, under the supervision of the Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity.

Tanger Med Passengers Port is the first entry point for Moroccans from all over the world to Morocco. In fact, it is expected to receive more than 1.5 million passengers during this 2022 campaign. This figure represents almost 50% of the general traffic that passes through the Strait of Gibraltar.

Every year, Tanger Med Passengers Port sets up a special device during the Marhaba campaign, to welcome Moroccans from all over the world in the best conditions.

The maritime fleet plan put in place by the Merchant Marine Department, to ensure the Tanger Med - Algeciras links, provides for a transport capacity of 40,000 passengers and 10,000 vehicles per day.

Vessels are also mobilized for long-distance crossings to Spain (in particular to the port of Barcelona), Italy (to the port of Genoa), and France (to the ports of Marseille and Sète). with a weekly transport capacity of 20,000 passengers and 7,000 cars.



With regard to facilities and services offered to passengers, Tanger Med Port has taken advantage of the period of forced stoppage due to the pandemic to make the necessary improvements to the reception facilities. As a result, a budget of 150 million MAD has been mobilized to prepare the transit operation, ensuring fluidity and health safety, through the strengthening of the reception, accommodation, and inspection capacities.

The number of stamping counters increased from 10 to 16 at the maritime level for pedestrian passengers, the deployment of 32 counters for vehicle passengers, the increase of shaded areas, the improvement of lighting, the development of areas dedicated to children and green spaces, as well as the establishment of drinking water fountains, restaurants, information points, and sanitary facilities, in addition to the development of an area dedicated to health inspection at the borders, and the establishment of other necessary service structures.

The necessary human resources have also been expanded to ensure the success of the "Marhaba 2022" operation in compliance with the sanitary situation and the public health of citizens, and this in close collaboration with all partners involved in this operation: the DGSN, the Gendarmerie, Customs, Auxiliary Forces, the Ministry of Health, local Authorities, under the overall coordination of the Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity.





IFACI CERTIFIES TANGER MED FOR ITS INTERNAL AUDIT OPERATIONS

In May 2022, Tanger Med Group was certified by IFACI Certification (Institut Français de l'Audit et du Contrôle Interne) for its internal audit activities, in accordance with the International Professional Practices Reference Framework of the Global Institute of Internal Auditors modeled in the "Référentiel Professionnel de l'Audit Interne "RPAI" version 2020."

The certification of internal audit activities by IFACI Certification guarantees compliance with 25 general requirements broken down into 100 detailed requirements of the RPAI and structured around 6 pillars: positioning of audit activities, planning and steering, GRC program "Governance, Risk, Compliance", professionalism, performance, and the audit process.

This international recognition rewards the efforts of Tanger Med Group and strengthens its credibility with various internal and external stakeholders.



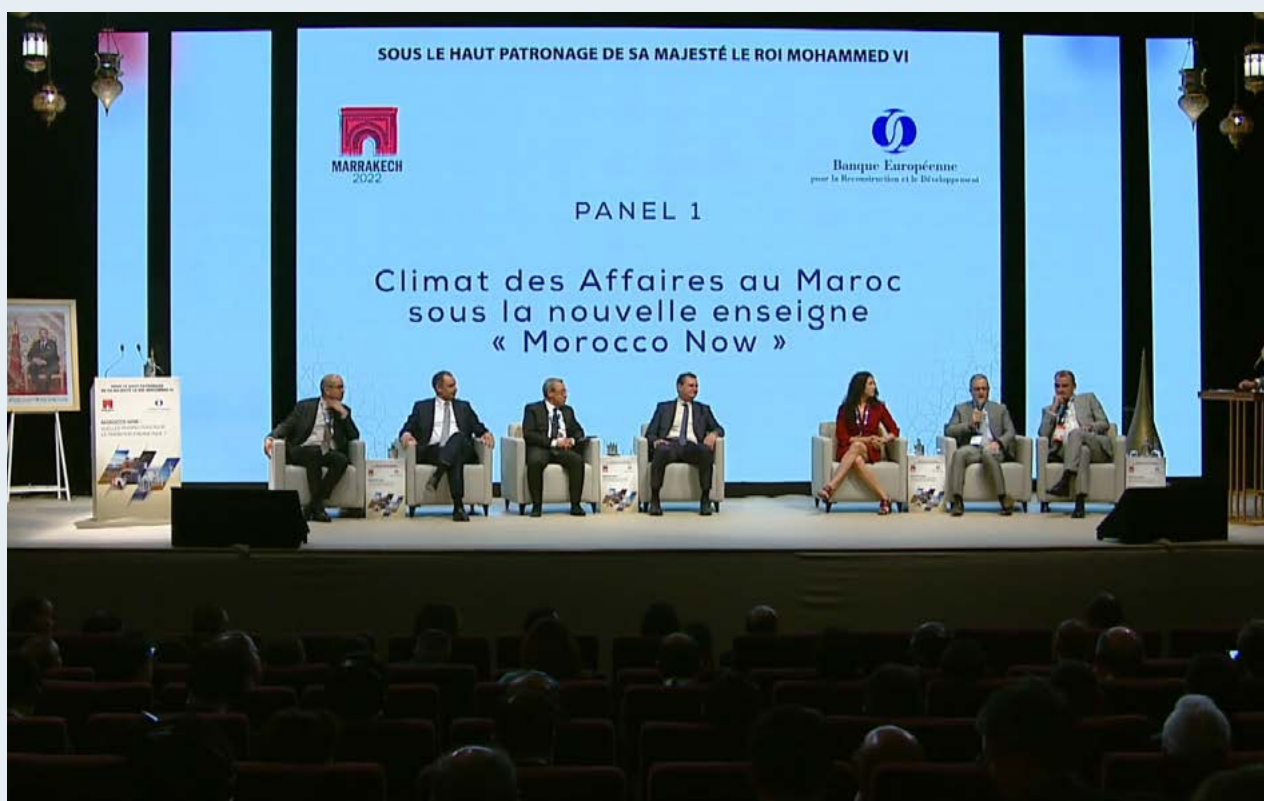
PARTICIPATION IN THE "MARKET FOCUS MOROCCO" HELD IN GENEVA

Organized jointly by the Swiss Chamber of Commerce in Morocco (CCSM) and the Geneva Chamber of Commerce, Industry, and Services (CCIG), the Market Focus Morocco took place on Tuesday, April 26, 2022 in Geneva and aimed to raise awareness on the investment opportunities offered by Morocco as well as to sensitize Swiss companies to the role that Morocco plays as a hub of trade and investment to Africa.

Several experts attended the event and exchanged views on Swiss-Moroccan bilateral relations and investment opportunities.

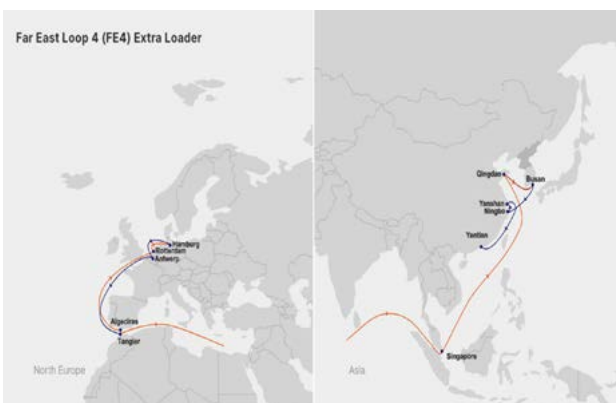


NEW HAPAG-LLOYD MARITIME SERVICES: THE WEST COAST SOUTH AMERICA EXPRESS (MSW) AND THE FAR EAST LOOP 4 (FE4)

The first weekly service (MSW) now offers a direct link between the Mediterranean and South America, with connections to and from Ecuador, Peru, Chile, and other destinations in the Caribbean and Central America.

With six dedicated vessels, this service provides competitive transit times for refrigerated cargo from northern Peru, Ecuador, and Costa Rica to the main markets of the Western Mediterranean.

The first call took place on June 13, 2022 at the Containers Terminal 3 operated by Tanger Alliance with the vessel EMMA A.



Operating weekly, the new Far East Loop service (FE4) includes several countries in its rotation including China, Singapore, South Korea, Spain, Belgium, the Netherlands, and Germany.



SUMITOMO GROUP'S SUBSIDIARY "SEBN" SETS UP IN MEDHUB

Specializing in the manufacture of electrical harnesses for the automotive industry and subsidiary of the Sumitomo Bordnetze group, SEBN-MA recently opened its 10,000 m² Advanced Supplier Warehouse (ASW) in the Logistics Zone of Tanger Med Port Complex.

Following the example of other automotive suppliers who have chosen "MEDHUB" for the installation of their ASW, the giant SEBN will have a state-of-the-art platform that offers logistic solutions for better management of its inventory and for processing its flows to its production site in Morocco while reducing delivery times.



BOLLORÉ LOGISTICS EXPANDS ITS OPERATIONS IN MEDHUB

Operating in "MEDHUB" since 2016, Bolloré Logistics, one of the world's leading logistics companies, is increasing its storage capacity in the "MEDHUB" Logistics Zone for the third time by moving into a new 4,000 m² warehouse. This expansion is part of its strategy to strengthen its position in Tanger Med Industrial Port Platform.

RENEWAL OF ISO 27001 CERTIFICATION

Tanger Med was able to renew its ISO 27001 certification, related to information security and attesting to its commitment in this area.

The Information Security Management System allows the governance of the security of information systems and aims to protect the digital and informational assets of the business.



TOTAL DIGITIZATION OF PROCEDURES DEDICATED TO CONTAINER ACTIVITY FOR SHIPPING AGENTS

In collaboration with the stakeholders of the container port dues process, including shipping lines and terminal operators, an automated processing system has been designed and developed through the Tanger Med Port Community system.

This processing makes it possible to make information exchanges more reliable, to centralize requests, and to optimize the various processing times until the issuing of the invoices in question.



IMPLEMENTATION OF AN ONLINE SOLUTION ACCESSIBLE TO USERS FOR MONITORING IMPORT AND EXPORT FLOWS

As part of Tanger Med's overall "paperless" initiative, which focuses on the digital transformation of the management of import and export flows, a regulation solution has been developed and put online to meet the need to organize passages between the various zones and inspection stages during port passage. The declarant in charge of a unit, whether for import or export, can find out through their Tanger Med Port Community System account the current status of their unit, and whether it is eligible to move on to the next stage of its route.

In practice, a declarant for an export unit may know that their unit is ready to:

- ▶ Proceed through the regulation
- ▶ Corridors Pass the inspection Scan
- ▶ Navigate to the terminal

A declarant for an import unit may know that their unit is ready to:

- ▶ Exit the terminal
- ▶ Navigate to the inspection area
- ▶ Exit the port (all prerequisites met)

The issuer can thus communicate this information to their representatives at the port level to guide them and optimize their operations.

The secure sharing of information in real time thus allows for the optimization of transit times while complying with the secure sharing of data of the different statement declarants.

PORT OF MOHAMMEDIA: SIMULATION EXERCISE TO TACKLE ACCIDENTAL MARINE POLLUTION BY HYDROCARBONS "SIMULEX 2022"

A simulation exercise to tackle accidental marine pollution by oil, entitled "Simulex 2022", was held on Wednesday June 22, 2022 near Mohammédia, as part of the implementation of the provisions of the National Emergency Plan (NEP) on the preparation and response to accidental marine pollution.

Organized by the Ministry of Energy Transition and Sustainable Development, in its capacity as national coordinator, this large-scale exercise, which continued until June 23rd, mobilized significant maritime, land, and air resources.

Within the framework of this same exercise, the DEPM tug ASSALAMA 2 successfully participated in this operation, in collaboration with all stakeholders.

The mission of the tug ASSALAMA 2 consisted of the assistance and towing of an oil tanker, from the area of the exercise, which is 8 miles from the anchorage to the anchorage area of the port of Mohammédia.



DEPL: PROCESSING OF IMPORTED WIND TURBINES

Marsa Maroc's teams at the port of Laâyoune, between June 2021 and May 2022, handled several shipments of wind turbines destined for the BOUJDOUR wind project. Nearly 261 wind turbine blades for a total tonnage of 48 KT were unloaded in the safest and most efficient conditions.

This highly technical operation required the use of cranes and high-capacity elevators and the mobilization of several teams.

"EMIRATES LOGISTICS" LOGISTICS CENTER STARTS OPERATIONS IN TANGER AUTOMOTIVE CITY

Emirates Logistics - a subsidiary of the Emirati Sharaf Group - is continuing its development in Morocco with the creation of its subsidiary Emirates Automotive Logistics and the construction of a new logistics center in Tanger Automotive City, in Tanger Med Industrial Platform, which offers just-in-time logistics services on finished products, raw materials, and spare parts, for industrial companies

The inauguration ceremony of the logistics center was presided over on Friday, June 10, 2022 by H.E ABDULLAH BIN TOUQAL MARRI, Minister of Economy of the United Arab Emirates, Mrs. NADIA FETTAH ALAOUI, Minister of Economy and Finance of Morocco, and Mr. MOHAMMED ABDELJALIL, Minister of Transport and Mr. FOUAD BRINI Chairman of Tanger Med Group.

The center covers an area of 14,500m² and employs a staff of 100 people working in shifts 7 days a week,

24 hours a day, offers a storage capacity of 15,000 pallets, with a secure mezzanine for the management of 10, 000 cartons for electronic parts and 14 docks allowing an inbound and outbound flow of 80 trucks per day.

Located in Morocco since 2016, Emirates Logistics employs more than 350 professionals, manages 47,600 m² of storage space spread over 5 logistics centers, and operates a fleet of 32 trucks. With this new site, Emirates Logistics confirms its position as a leader in logistics services in Morocco and Africa by offering tailor-made solutions that meet the challenges of its customers by relying on talented and flexible teams, infrastructure, and modern and clean equipment, safe and responsible working environment, reliable and innovative technological systems and processes.



GERMAN GROUP "SCS" STAHLSCHMIDT INTERNATIONAL HOLDING GMBH SETS UP IN TANGER AUTOMOTIVE CITY

On June 22, 2022, the German Group Stahlschmidt International Holding GmbH (SCS) inaugurated a plant specializing in components and assemblies for mechanical unlocking systems, in Tanger Automotive City, in Tanger Med Industrial Platform.

Built on a plot of 21,400 m² (9,400 m² built to date, and 12,000 m² will be completed in January 2023), this plant, whose realization was accompanied by the Ministry of Industry and Trade, required an investment of 107 million MAD and will allow the creation of 1,075 jobs and the achievement of an annual turnover of more than 400 million MAD.

Specialized in the production of innovative Bowden cables, unlocking units, and plastic injection molded components, this plant aims to meet the growing needs of Tier 1 automotive manufacturers and suppliers: VW, Martur, Fujikura, Audi, Skoda, Renault, PSA, Daimler, Faurecia, etc.

Complete Bowden cable systems for automotive and industrial applications will be produced to the highest quality and environmental standards and shipped worldwide.



LYCÉE MÉDITERRANÉEN (MEDITERRANEAN HIGH SCHOOL): SELECTION CAMPAIGN FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

The scientific preparatory classes of excellence supported by Tanger Med Group and its Foundation have started their selection campaign for the 2022-2023 academic year. Organized in Roadshows, the objective is to introduce the Lycée Méditerranéen (LYMED) and the preparatory classes system to deserving high school graduates.

The school's management teams have travelled to different regions of the Kingdom to visit numerous high schools and present the model of excellence that LYMED is part of, while helping to inform high school graduates about the career opportunities available to them.

The Roadshows took place over a period of more than three months and allowed the teams to meet with more than 2,600 high school graduates and first-year MPSI students from 78 high schools across Morocco. The presentations of the teams were well received by the students and the supervisory staff of the visited high schools, who were able to ask insightful questions and clarify many doubts about their post-bac orientation.

The Roadshows campaign ended on March 26th with an Open Day in which LYMED's first-year students actively participated. LYMED welcomed more than 300 visitors. Graduates, parents, and guidance counselors were given an introduction to the school's pedagogical approach and the campus facilities, thus benefiting from an immersion in the daily life of LYMED students. The program included presentations on studying at the CPGE d'excellence, scientific experiments, and guided tours led by the students.





GOODWILL, A VALUE IN ACTION

Goodwill is one of the four values of the Lycée Méditerranéen. Convinced that it is a key vector of performance, the teams ensure that it is instilled and complied within the relationships that students have with their peers, staff, but also with the local communities and the territory in which they evolve.

The holy month of Ramadan was a first opportunity for the students to become familiar with the world of volunteerism. In partnership with the Association Génération Challenge of Fnideq, a collective Iftar for the benefit of children in need was organized by the LYMED teams with the active participation of the students.

More than a meal, this Iftar was an opportunity for the students to exchange with the children and teenagers present, in particular on the importance of studies, and the need to establish a strong ambition for their future. Closed by a show hosted by the children of the school, the evening was full of interest, both for the children and for the students of LYMED. In addition, and in the continuity of the associative work undertaken, a blood donation day was organized within the school with the valuable collaboration of the Regional Center of Blood Transfusion of Tétouan. This was an opportunity for all the students, faculty, and administrative staff to demonstrate their commitment to citizenship.

"Give your blood to make the world's heart beat", a slogan that resounded within the walls of the Lycée, raising awareness among the young people for a crucial mobilization for many of our fellow citizens.



THE CULTURE OF SPORTS

Sports are a key factor in the success of students in preparatory classes, promoting better concentration, team spirit, and physical fitness, allowing them to approach the Grandes Écoles exams under optimal conditions.

The LYMED campus has nearly 12,000 square meters of sports facilities that allow for regular sports practice among students but also among the entire school community.

The month of Ramadan was the occasion to organize two sports tournaments. The first one brought together the students of LYMED and their colleagues from the preparatory classes of Tétouan. The LYMED students won the women's and men's basketball finals and lost to the students of the CPGE of Tétouan in the men's soccer final. This event was an opportunity to strengthen the relationship between the two schools and to hone the students' competitive skills.

A second tournament was organized, this time for LYMED employees as well as employees of neighboring businesses. The event, which lasted the whole month of Ramadan, was a real success with the participation of about ten teams. The final was won by the team made up of LYMED employees and members of the CIRE Technologies subsidiary against the Tanger Med Zones subsidiary. Representatives of the local authorities as well as the Group's Top Management were invited to present the medals to the finalists.



1337 MED CAMPUS WELCOMES ITS FIRST POOLS IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF 2022

The 1337 MED coding school has launched its first two "pools", each lasting four weeks and during which candidates can code seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day. The pools are the main entrance exam to the school and are a crucial step in the selection and admission process.

After passing the online tests and check-in, candidates registered for the "pools" on a first-come, first-served basis were invited to join the 1337 MED campus. Coming from all over the Kingdom, more than 300 young people from all social backgrounds were able to experience this first immersion based on the Peer-learning pedagogical model, a learning process that is built through exchange with peers.

The students were able to take advantage of all the logistical and practical support allowing them to take their exams in the best conditions (daily shuttle, food services, accommodations, facilities, etc.). At the end of the competition and the rankings obtained, 150 students were selected to embark on the 1337 adventure during an average three-and-a-half year

curriculum that allows them to enter the job market at the same time thanks to various internship periods.

Since its launch, several companies have expressed their interest in the training as well as the future graduates of the school. They did not hesitate to visit the campus to see the facilities, but above all to understand the 1337 pedagogy and the skills developed by its students. These visits once again confirmed the relevance of such training to the challenges of integrating young people into the workforce and making the Tanger Med ecosystem more attractive.





TANGER MED FOUNDATION ACCOMPANIES THE CROSSING OF THREE MOROCCAN SWIMMERS AT THE STRAIT OF GIBRALTAR

Tanger Med Foundation supported the Moroccan champion Hassan Baraka in his crossing of the Strait of Gibraltar led by two Moroccan athletes: Samia Benchekroun and Fakhita Drissi organized in collaboration with ACNEG (Asociación del Cruce a Nado del Estrecho de Gibraltar), the crossing was carried out from Tarifa in Spain with an arrival at the beach of Dalia, near Tanger Med Port.

Upon arrival, the swimmers were greeted by the children of the Dalia Sailing School and by the beachgoers.

It is worth mentioning that the crossing of the Strait of Gibraltar by swimming is one of the 7 most difficult crossings in the world (it counts for the Ocean Sevens challenge, equivalent to the Seven Summits in mountaineering).

Tanger Med Foundation continues to promote water sports and their importance to young people, while reflecting a number of common values, including courage, well-being, and social cohesion.



OPENING OF THE LOUIYED MOSQUE - KSAR AL MAJAZ

On the basis of an agreement signed with the Ministry of Habus and Islamic Affairs, the Foundation undertook the demolition and reconstruction of the Louiyed mosque in the Ksar Al Majaz municipality.

The opening of the mosque took place on the first day of the holy month of Ramadan which allowed the local population to enjoy the modern and functional facilities of this new mosque.

For this project, Tanger Med Foundation called upon the expertise of local master craftsmen in the field of decorative and ornamental work. With dexterity and agility, the mâallems have completed works of carved wood, zellij beldi, plaster, brassware, calligraphy ... giving birth to a space evoking the pure Arab-Muslim tradition.

CONSTRUCTION OF THE ZAHARA PRESCHOOL

In response to the request of the local communities, the Foundation agreed to launch the construction of a pre-school in the Zahara douar, Ksar Sghir municipality.

The project responds to the problem of the lack of pre-school infrastructures dedicated to young children who struggle to integrate into the primary school system without having been able to benefit from a preschool learning program.

The work has now started and will include the construction and development of:

- 3 preschool classes
- 1 multi-purpose class
- 1 executive office
- Sanitary facilities for boys, girls, adults
- Courtyard
- Enclosure wall



CLOSING OF THE ART WORKSHOPS IN SCHOOLS

With a focus on encouraging artistic creativity and freedom of expression, the Foundation's art workshop season has come to a close in various rural schools.

As many as 170 students participated in art and culture programs in various disciplines:

- ▶ Reading and writing workshop, Al Yassamine school - Jouamâa Municipality
- ▶ Reading and writing workshop, Nouinouich School Consortium - Bahraouiyyine Municipality
- ▶ Andalusian music workshop, Ksar Sghir Vocational High School - Ksar Sghir Municipality
- ▶ Choir workshop, Community Center - Melloussa Municipality
- ▶ Painting workshop, Omar Ibn Khattab Community School - Khmiss Anjra Municipality
- ▶ Painting workshop, Ibn Toumert High School - Belyounech Municipality
- ▶ School theater workshop, Dar Talib de Jouamâa - Jouamâa Municipality
- ▶ School theater workshop, Abdelkrim Khattabi Junior High - Ksar Al Majaz Municipality

The deliberations with the pedagogical teams of the involved schools have shown that the workshops constitute a different, playful, and motivating learning environment. The impact on the students was noted in particular in speaking, imagination, and openness to foreign languages.

Implemented gradually since 2018, the art workshops are, today, an indispensable support for the development of children in rural areas and are becoming more and more popular in the region.



CLOSING OF THE ARTISTIC WORKSHOP PROGRAM AT THE SOCIO-CULTURAL CENTER OF TÉTOUAN

Tanger Med Foundation had renewed its partnership with the Mohammed VI Foundation for the Promotion of Social Works of Education-Training to enroll students from the Khmiss Anjra municipality in the art workshop program at the Socio-Cultural Center of Tétouan.

The partnership has facilitated access for 30 students to the highly sought-after art disciplines of music, sculpture, and digital painting based on interactive teaching techniques.

The program has helped to address the problem of lack of cultural space in the town and to take advantage of infrastructure dedicated to youth in the city of Tétouan.



LAUNCH OF THE ANNUAL "DALIA CLEAN BEACH 2022" PROGRAM

Tanger Med Foundation has launched the "Dalia Clean Beach" program for the 2022 summer season. The program includes development work, equipment, cleaning, and environmental awareness, in partnership with the Mohammed VI Foundation for Environmental Protection.

This summer, the annual #b7arblaplastic campaign will be held again in order to mobilize summer residents and sea users against plastic pollution.

The specific facilities of the Dalia beach will be available to summer visitors from June 15th to September 15th, namely the Dalia beach library as well as the device for launching and accompanying individuals with disabilities.

Since Dalia Clean Beach is an evolving program that develops in continuity, a green area will be developed at the main entrance to the beach. This new area will enhance environmental awareness and commitment to sustainable development.

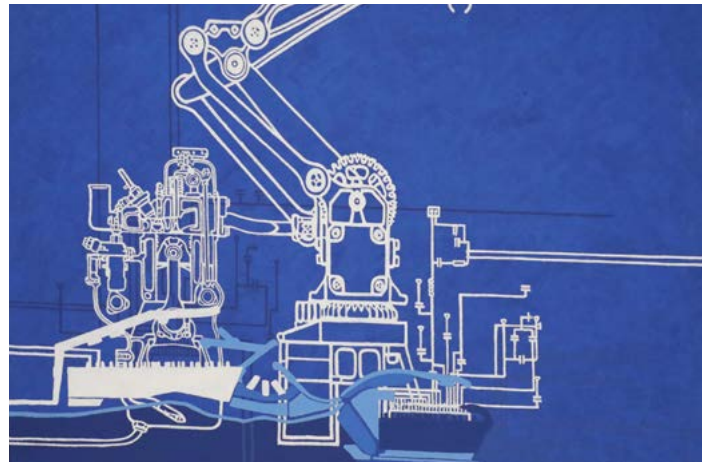
